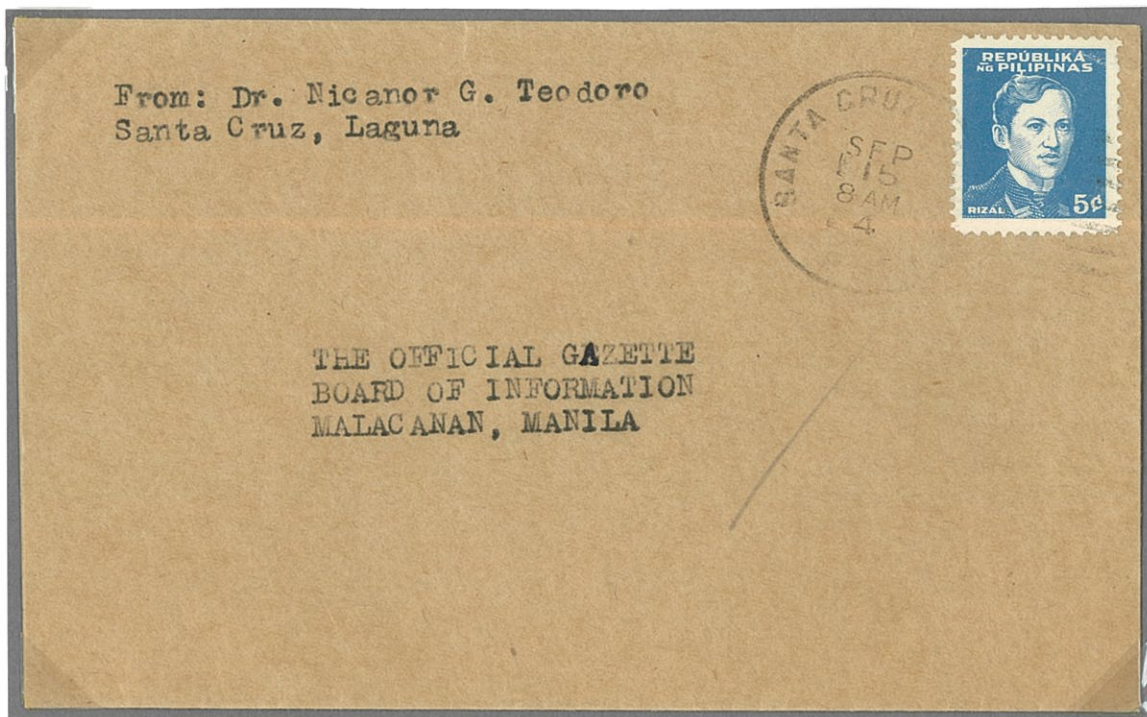


Usage of 5C Perforated Stamp – Single First Class Mail



Sep. 15, 1944, Single First Class Mail,
Santa Cruz, Laguna to Manila
Single Franking of 5C perforated stamp for proper 5C single mail rate.

Outbound to Japan



Apr. 8, 1944, Triple First Class Registered Mail
Manila to Kanagawa, Japan
Mix Franking of a horizontal strip of three 5C perforated stamps and
a 12C perforated stamp for 27C triple first class mail rate.
Scarce Usage: Multiple usage of this issue is seldom encountered.
