November 25, 1965 MAPILINDO CONFERENCE



The MAPILINO stamps come out today as a belated tribute to the Summit Conference which was held in Manila, upon the initiative of Pres. Diosdado Macapagal, from July 30 to August 5, 1963.

The 'Summit Conference' paved the way for the establishment of "MAPHILINDO" (Malaya, Philippines, Indonesia), an organization that would bring closer the people of the three nations.

Philatelic Artists Nemesio Dimanlig, Jr. and Antonio Chuidian, Jr., depicted on the stamps the three leaders (Indonesia's Pres. Sukarno, Philippine Pres. Macapagal and Malaysia's Premier Tunuk Abdul Rahman) in the act of signing the MAPHILINDO documents. The historic occasion was held at the Hall of Flags of the Foreign Affairs Department on Padre Faura Street in Manila.

On top of the stamps are the flags of the three nations and at the bottom is the word Pilipinas (Philippines). Vertically arranged on the right side are the words: "Mapilindo, Parangal Sa Kapulungang Tgatog Sa Maynila Noong 1963," which, in English reads: MAPHILINDO, In Honor of the Summit Conference in Manila in 1963. The denomination and the word Koreo (postage) are also on the right side of the stamps.
