
November 12, 1970 TOURIST ATTRACTION SPOTS I



TOURIST ATTRACTION STAMPS

The Bureau of Posts issues today, November 12, 1970 the first of four series of Tourist Attraction Spots Stamps.

The stamps, printed in 5 colors by heliogravure process, measures 34x44.99 mm, perforation to perforation, each sheet containing 50 pieces. Four denominations (10-sentimo, 20-sentimo, 30-sentimo and 2-piso) were printed, each numbering 2,000,000.

10-sentimo: Shown at the background are the Hundred Islands of Pangasinan and a ferryboat near by ready to ferry tourists and visitors around; at the right foreground is an oxen-driven cart loaded with native wares starting its trip to different places in the country where people are eager to buy the beautifully manufactured articles.

20-sentimo: Pasonanca Park in Zamboanga City, gives a scenic view of the country's natural beauty. The park, also known as Limbaga Memorial Park in honor of Scout Limbaga, who died in a plane crash together with other scouts and scouters, occasionally serves as a camp site for the Boy Scouts of the Philippines during their annual jamborees. Center of attraction is the unique, completely furnished house of native materials built on a tree overlooking the park and reached by a semicircular flight of stairs made of steel. Honeymooners find it quite fascinating.

30-sentimo: Pictured is the sugar industry in the island of Negros which is known as the sugarland of the Philippines. The foreground presents a picture of laborers harvesting sugar cane to be milled in a sugar central shown at the background near the foot of Mt. Kanlaon. Also shown is an allegorical sta-tue of a Filipina on a carabao, symbolizing agriculture..

2-piso: The Miagao Church in Iloilo is one of the tourist spots in the Visayas. Its solid foundation and its style and architecture are a reminiscence of the past Spanish era when the horse-driven two-wheeled calesa, also depicted on the stamp, was most popular among the riding public
