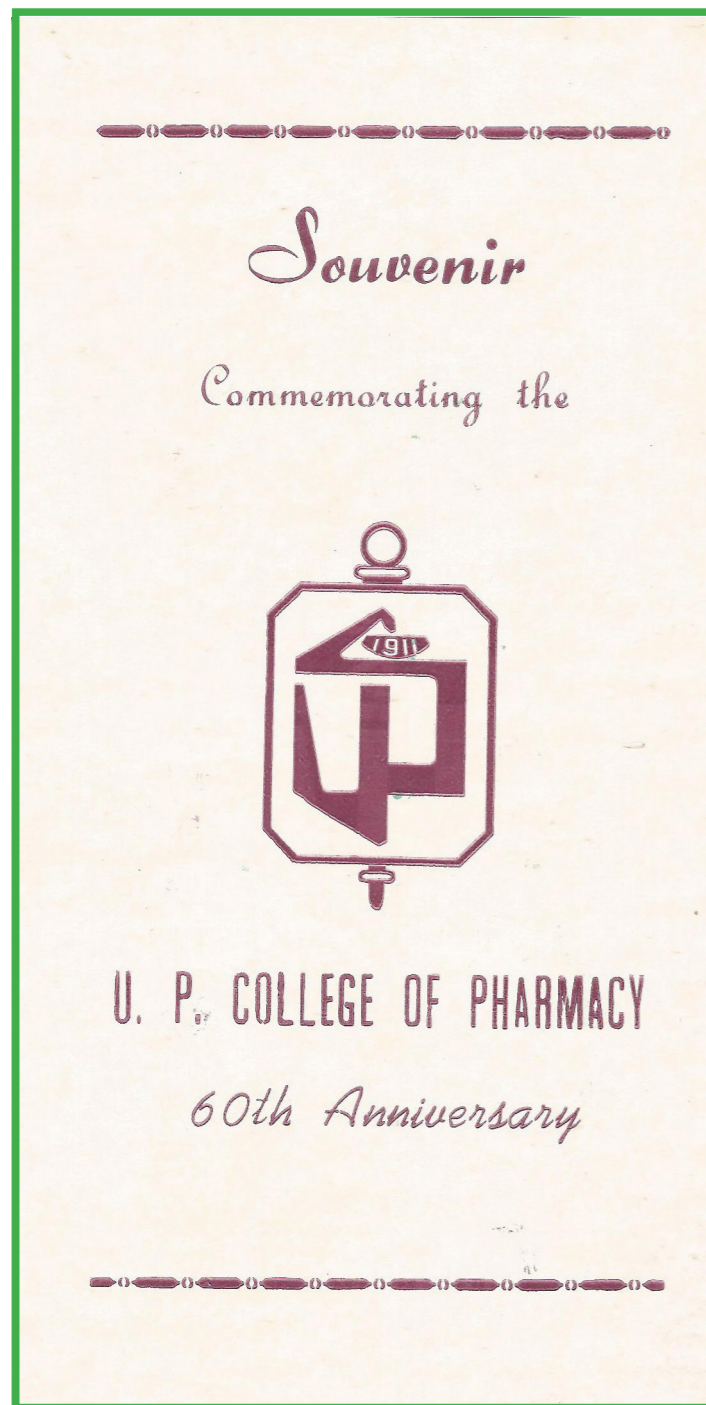

**UP COLLEGE OF PHARMACY
60th Anniversary**

The Bureau of Posts issues today, December 11, 1972, the 60th Year of Service College of Pharmacy, University of the Philippines Stamps. The special stamps measure 33x48 mm printed size, in denominations of 5-sentimo, 10-sentimo and 30-sentimo and in quantities of (1,000,000), (5,000,000) and (1,000,000) respectively. There are 50 stamps in a sheet, printed in five-colors Heliogravure process by Joh Enschede en Zonen, Haarlem, Holland. The stamps were designed by Robert Naval of the Designing Staff of the Bureau of Posts.

The need for offering a pharmacy course in the University of the Philippines was felt as early as 1910.

Instruction started in June 1911 as a course in pharmacy under the administrative control of the College of Liberal Arts.

To meet the needs of the growing student body and insure coordination of instruction, the Board of Regents authorized the opening of a separate pharmacy school under the administration of the College of Medicine.

The transfer stimulated pharmaceutical instruction in the University and the pharmacy school's field of activity and usefulness was enlarged.

The College of Pharmacy now occupies the third floor and part of the second floor of Pavillon I of the Palma Hall in the Diliman Campus.
