PPC FLASHES

Greetings! Kasama—
This is to introduce to you the PPC FLASHES, another addition in the PPC march of progress. Future FLASHES will be sent to you from time to time and to all Kasamas, we believe, they will be of much avail as a matter of guide and reference.

CULTURAL VALUE OF STAMPS: Following the enlightening lecture of Kasama Carceller last June 4, on "How To Mount Stamps", will be another lecture by Kasama Dr. Celis on "The Cultural Value of Stamps." In view of Kasama Celis' study of the cultural influence of stamps, this lecture promises to be one of interest and definite contribution to philatelic knowledge. All Kasamas are therefore enjoined not to miss this affair which will be held on July 16.

CLUB TO HAVE TWO AUCTIONS MONTHLY: After a lengthy deliberation re the holding of two auctions a month instead of only one, the Club unanimously approved (with only one dissenting vote), the motion that the Club will hold an auction every first and third Sunday of the month, thus 1st Sunday, Special Auction (10 members) and 3rd Sunday Regular Auction to go with lecture and business meeting. It was the unanimous opinion that such a step is toward the benefit of all Kasamas.

JUNIORS ORGANIZE: Showing an equal enthusiasm like their Senior Kasamas, the Junior are all geared for a concerted action towards organizing themselves into a unit of the PPC. The Juniors have the assurance of their Senior Kasamas for a whole-hearted support and it seems the Executive Council may designate a Junior "expert" to lay their ground work and make representations for them in the council of the Senior Kasamas.

NEW REVENUE STAMPS "REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES": In response to our inquiry of recent date, the Bureau of Customs and Internal Revenue informs us in a letter dated June 3 that new Internal Revenue stamps bearing the inscription "Republic of the Philippines" are now available to collectors for philatelic purposes. Denominations of the stamps are: 10, 20, 50-centavo and 1—peso, or a total face value of P1.80 per set. The stamps are printed in yellow-green, bricked-red, yellow and red-brown, respectively. Initial printing of each value are: 10c—500,000; 20c—1,000,000; 50c—1,000,000; and 1P—500,000. They were printed at the Bureau of Printing, Manila, First Day Sale of the stamps was made on March 6, 1944, in Manila. From the letter we received from the Bureau of Customs and Internal Revenue, we understand that the new revenue stamps are sold to taxpayers only. However, members of the PPC who desire to obtain these new revenue stamps may therefore place their orders with Kasama Teodoro Protomartir, who, incidentally, is the new Chairman of the PPC New Issue Service. Deadline for accepting orders is June 23, 1944. No service charge whatsoever is collected by our Club on any stamp reservation or orders made by any members, as this is one of YOUR privileges which the PPC wants you to enjoy, gratis et amore. Hence, place your orders early and avoid disappointments later.
