WHAT DO YOU THINK

I think many of our old stamp collectors and dealers are "biting off their tongues" nowadays as fantastic prices are being paid by present day collectors. Take the case of one collector who remarked to me one day, "If I could remember how many I had of the Madrid-Manila and how they all passed away from my hands, I could just pull out my hair. (I think he did if you know whom I mean). Well, anyway, no use crying over spilled milk. The thing to remember is that, of the stamps issued before the war, not one item turned out to be a "water stock", if you know your stock market. But what about our present issues? Are they of any comparison with the Pre-War issues? One can never say unless we play prophet. Let us remember two things however. First, it is not the quantity of the stamps printed that determines the future value but how much of the stamps are preserved and available from collectors' hands. Second, which of these stamps preserved will attract other collectors to possess them. This simple rule is on the average, the law of stamp investment.

We can avoid a lot of hair pulling and tongue biting if we apply this simple rule to our present issues. **WHAT DO YOU THINK?**
