CHECK LIST—POSTAL ISSUES—
PHILIPPINE REPUBLIC

FLASH! In observance of the First Anniversary of the Philippine Independence, the *PPC Flashes* deemed it worthwhile to furnish members of the PPC, a check list of the postal issues of the Philippine Republic, as chronicled on the reverse of this postal card for philatelic purposes. As it will be observed, within one year of existence of the Republic of the Philippines, the Bureau of Communications, Manila, has issued 33 different postal items, consisting of 14 commemorative stamps, 7 regular postage, 3 semi-postals, 4 official stamps, 3 postal stationery (2 stamped envelopes & 1 official postal card) and 2 miniature sheets, all of which have a total face value of P11.09 excluding the 2 miniature sheets with a face value of 34c each, but sold by the Bureau of Communications to the public at P2.50 (Independence) and P1.00 (National Heroes). In passing, mention may be made that for the first time in the history of philately in the Philippines, the Bureau of Communications, during the first year of the Republic of the Philippines, have used, aside from official cachets, 5 different commemorative postmarks regardless of the stamps to which they were applied. Two of these commemorative postmarks (June 19 & Aug. 28/44) were numbered from 1 to 10 and the last one (Sep. 7/44) was from 1 to 12, all of which may be compared with the scenery and commemorative postmarks of pre-war and wartime Japan.—PME.
