ANTONIO MARIA BARRETTO

Antonio Maria Barretto was born in Quiapo, Manila on September 4, 1865, one of four children from parents Antonio Vicente Barretto Gonzalez and Trinidad Rocha Ycaza. Earliest records show Antonio Maria Barretto working as a clerk from 1885 with his father, A V Barretto, who operated a merchant business located at Sampaloc 50, Manila. The company moved to Sampaloc 38, Manila in 1888, and Antonio Maria remained working there up to 1896 or 1897. Additionally, between 1889 and 1894, Antonio Maria, alongside his brother Ricardo Esteban, worked as clerks for the merchant company Warner, Blodgett & Company located at Muelle del Rey 7, Manila.

In 1895, Antonio Maria started his own Custom House Broker business, trading as A M Barretto, with the following employees: E Debloys (assistant), R Santos (clerk), J Santos (clerk), F Barretto (clerk), L Monroy (clerk), A Romero (clerk), F Ramirez (clerk), and C Concepcion (clerk). Soon afterwards, the brothers Antonio Maria and Ricardo Esteban form Barretto & Company. In 1898, records show the company located at Barraca 2, Manila with the following staff: A M Barretto (merchant), R E Barretto (merchant), L Elzingre (clerk), J M Villareal (clerk) and J Torres (clerk).

Between 1900 and 1903, Barretto & Company lists the following staff: A M Barretto (merchant), R E Barretto (merchant), L Elzingre Dumas (signs per pro), and J M Villareal (cashier). The company moves premises to Barraca 4 between 1902 and 1904. In 1905, Barretto & Company relocate premises to Plaza Calderon 48, Manila, expanding the business as managers of Steamers 'San Joaquin' and 'Gloria'.

Between 1908 and 1910, Barretto & Company held offices at Plaza Calderon de la Barca 20. In addition to running the company, both Antonio Maria and Ricardo Esteban were General Managers for La Insular Cigar and Cigarette Factory, located at Binondo Square 20, Manila. The last known records for Barretto & Company show the business located at General Solano 346, San Miguel, but no list of staff were noted. Additionally, no further information has been found for Antonio Maria Barretto from 1910, other than notice of his death on March 8, 1929 in Manila at the age of 64. He was buried at San Agustin Church, Intramuros, Manila.

'A M Barretto' Handstamps used whilst he was a Customs House Agent for the Maritime and Customs Agency are known on stamps issued between 1890 and 1896, aligning to the period when Antonio Maria was working for A V Barretto.

Historical Timeline

1862 - 1872

Earliest records show Antonio Vicente (AV) Barretto working as a clerk for merchants Peele, Hubbell & Company, Manila.

1885

First records that show A V Barretto, merchants, located at Sampaloc 50, Manila, with the following staff: Antonio Vicente Barretto (merchant) and Antonio Maria Barretto (clerk).

Records also show Ricardo Esteban Barretto working as a clerk for Peele, Hubbel & Company.

1888

A V Barretto now located at Sampaloc 38, same staff.

Ricardo Esteban Barretto working as clerk with merchants Warner, Blodgett & Company, located at Muelle del Rey 7, Manila.

Historical Timeline

1889 - 1894

Antonio Maria joins Ricardo Esteban working as clerks for Warner, Blodgett & Company. Antonio Maria is also recorded as working as a clerk for A V Barretto.

1895

Antonio Maria continues to work as a clerk for A V Barretto. Antonio Maria also starts his own company as a Custom House Brokerage, with the following staff: A M Barretto (Custom House Broker), R Santos (clerk), J Santos (clerk), F Barretto (clerk), L Monroy (clerk), A Romero (clerk), E Deldoys (clerk), F Ramirez (clerk) and C Concepcion (clerk).

Ricardo Esteban continues to work for Warner, Blodgett & Company.

1898

A V Barretto still showed operating at Sampaloc 38, but no further mention of Antonio Maria working for the company.

Between 1896 and 1897, Barretto & Company is formed with Antonio Maria and Ricard Esteban as proprietors. The company is located at Barraca 2, with the following staff: Antonio Maria Barretto (merchant), Ricardo Esteban (merchant), L Elzingre Dumas (clerk), J M Villareal (clerk) and J Torres (clerk).

Ricardo Esteban Barretto is also shown working for merchants Warner, Barnes & Company located at Muelle de Rey 7, Manila.

1900 - 1901

Barretto & Company is recorded with the following staff: Antonio Maria Barretto (merchant), Ricardo Esteban Barretto (merchant), L Elzingre Dumas (signs per procuration) and J M Villareal (cashier). No further mention of A V Barretto.

1902 - 1904

Barretto & Company relocate premises to Barraca 4, Manila. The company is joined by F Lafont (clerk) in 1904.

1905

Barretto & Company relocate premises to Plaza Calderon 48, Manila. The company is registered as managers of Steamers 'San Joaquin' and 'Gloria'. Staff members: Antonio Maria Barretto (merchant), Ricardo Esteban Barretto (merchant), L Elzingre Dumas (signs per procuration), C Rolha (clerk), F Lafont (clerk) and F Reyes (clerk).

1908 - 1910

Barretto & Company operating from Plaza Calderon de la Barca 20, Manila. Staff members: Antonio Maria Barretto (merchant), Ricardo Esteban Barretto (merchant), F D Barretto (merchant - only in 1908), L Elzingre Dumas (signs per procuration), J Sopungco. In addition, Antoio Maria Barretto and Ricardo Esteban Barretto are recorded as General Managers for La Insular & Cigarette Factory, located at Binondo Square 20, Manila.


1912




