BARLOW, MORRIS AND WILSON

MORRIS, BARLOW & COMPANY

John Simeon Barlow and Frederick Wilson were English engineers and machinists located in the Philippines from the early 1870s. The first mention of Barlow is in 1873 working for the firm Morris, Barlow & Company located at Jolo 20, Manila. The company staff included: J Samuel Morris, J S Barlow and Evan Edwards (master founder). In 1874 the company expands with increased staff where Frederick Wilson (travelling engineer) joins the company along with Chas Taylor (shop foreman), J C Roldan (draftsman) and Segundo Aguirre. Morris, Barlow & Company is contracted as engineers to the Manila Aerated Bread Company. Records show Morris, Barlow & company still in operations in 1876 but no further records are found from 1877, assuming that the company ceased operations sometime in late 1876.

BARLOW & WILSON

In 1879, Barlow & Wilson (Company) are recorded as consulting engineers and engineering agents with John Simeon Barlow and Frederick Wilson leading the company, with the following staff: Ambrosie Salvador, Evselio Estavislao and Florentino Moya. In 1882, Frederick Wilson takes up office in Iloilo with John Simeon Barlow running the Manila office. J C Grant Wilson joins the firm in Manila and is assigned signatory per procuration for the Iloilo branch. On May 24, 1886, John Simeon Barlow died in Manila. No further records for Barlow & Wilson appear from 1888, assuming the company ceased operations around the time of John Barlow's death.

FRED WILSON & COMPANY

Frederick Wilson remained in the Machinery and Supplies business in Manila. An article states that 'at the end of the 1890s, Englishman Fred (assuming Frederick) Wilson and partners were selling milling equipment and servicing all kinds of steam operated mills and other machinery'. In 1905 Fred Wilson is teamed up with J F Loader (engineer). Records between 1909 and 1917 show Fred Wilson & Company as consulting engineers, contractors and engineering agents, located at 41 Urbiztondo, Manila. J F Loader and C A Clear (assistant) are staff in the company. The latest records are obtained from a commercial cover in April 1937 showing Fred Wilson & Company operating from 53-55 Barraca, Manila. No further records are found after this date.




