Bazar Filipino was mainly a depot for stationeries and paper products, periodicals and books established in 1864. In 1873, records show Bazar Filipino located at Escolta 37, Manila, with the following staff: G A Baer (merchant), E Lopez (clerk) and Leopold Hubert Francois Warlomont (clerk). 1875 shows the inclusion of A Blaival (clerk). G A Baer ended his employment sometime in 1875 when he moved to work for Baer Senior & Company that same year. Between 1879 and 1888 the company was run by Leopold Warlomont (merchant / storekeeper), Paul Warlomont (clerk / assistant), E Warlomont (assistant), and H Warlomont (assistant). In 1888, Leopold Warlomont is shown as residing in Paris.

In 1889, the company is referred to as 'Bazar Filipino', Warlomont Hermanos (Brothers). The company moved to new premises at Escota 33, San Jacinto 2 & 4. E Warlomont, and Paul Warlomont are recorded as storekeepers. 1894 records Paul Warlomont moving to Paris, with E Warlomont (storekeeper) and L Patoux (assistant) working for Bazar Filipino. The company continues without too much change up to the end of the 19th century. 1899 shows E Warlomont residing in Paris, with P Warlomont back in Manila with P Chavant and Henry George working for Bazar Filipino.

Between 1902 and 1905, during the US occupation, 'Bazar Filipino', Warlomont Hermanos was located at Escolta 113, San Jacinto 44 & 46 with the following staff: Paul Warlomont (Paris), E Warlomont (proprietor), P Chavant (assistant) Henry George (assistant) and G O'Farrell (clerk). 1908 to 1910 shows Paul Warlomont as residing in Dresden and E Warlomont in Paris, leaving Henry George (manager with authority to sign per procuratoin), G O'Farrell and J Berthoud as staff at the Bazar Filipino. With the Warlomont's no longer in the Philippines, Henry George takes over as proprietor of Bazar Filipino between 1912 and 1920.

1922 shows the company reverting back to Bazar Filipino as the company name most likely due to the devolvement of the Warlomonts. Location remains at



Escolta 113 with Milton E Springer (manager), George L McGee (assistant manager) and V Alcalde (bookkeeper) as working for the company. No further records have been found beyond this date.




