Botica de Santa Cruz (originally called Farmacia y Drogueria de Santa Cruz), an established drug store located at Plaza de Goiti (now called Plaza Lacson), Santa Cruz, Manila, was purchased by Friedrich (Don Federico) Steck in 1857 for P12,000. Friedrich was married to Isabela Gonzales Tuason (daughter of one of the wealthiest families in Manila). In 1861, Steck sold the company to Agustin Westernhagen, a German pharmacist working at the Botica. Records show Westernhagen as owner of Botica de Santa Cruz until 1876.



Records show Paul (Pablo) Schuster, a chemist, as proprietor of the Botica located at Plaza de Santa Cruz between 1877 and 1892. In 1889, the following staff are recorded at the address of Goiti 8, Plaza de Santa Cruz: Pablo Schuster (absent), Andreas Krapfenbauer (chemist), A Matthies (assistant), H Sander (assistant), R Ampnero, and T Marti (assistant). Additionally, a branch, trading under Pablo Schuster, was established in Cebu with assistants L Santos and D Aguilar. No further records of Pablo Schuster appear from 1892, at which time U Rodriguez is shown as the proprietor of Botica de Santa Cruz. Records state Pablo Schuster passed away in 1905.

Between 1892 and 1902, records show Teodoro Meyer y Cia as proprietors of Farmacio y Drogueria de Santa Cruz located at Plaza de Goiti. 1892 records show the Botica managed by Teodoro Meyer, supported by Andreas Krapfenbauer and M Grossman. In 1894 records show the Botica managed by Teodoro Meyer and Andreas Krapfenbauer, assisted by F Dreiss, L Gonzales and A Carascoso. The Branch in Cebu

was managed by L Santos in 1892; M Grossmann and P. Rivera in 1894; with no further records found from 1898. Between 1898 and 1899, Teodoro Meyer remains as proprietor, assisted by A Scholtz, L Gonzales and V Alberto. Between 1900 and 1901, staff include: Teodoro Meyer (absent), Luis Santos, Dr Carlos Jährling, L Gonzales and R Alvares.

In 1902, Botica de Santa Cruz (Santa Cruz Drug Store) is purchased and managed by Mr Luis Santos (Filipino born Spaniard) and Dr Carlos Jährling (German-Filipino pharmacist) and supported by Adolf Rothe (assistant), Matias Garcia Jr (custom-house clerk) and John Gray (bookkeeper and cashier). Records between 1908 and 1912 show that the company Santos & Jährling, wholesale and retail druggists, were trading as Botica de Santa Cruz, Plaza de Goiti, Santa Cruz, Manila with Carl Müller as manager.

Records after 1912 show that Botica de Santa Cruz was under the ownership of Carlos Jährling, with no further mention of Luis Santos. During World War I, Botica de Santa Cruz was seized by the US Governor General under the 'Trading with the Enemy Act' of October 6, 1917, which called for the sequestration of enemy properties during the hostilities. As a consequence, Carlos Jährling, at the age of 42, was detained and transferred to the Angel Island Immigration Station in San Francisco, USA, arriving on September 12, 1918. It is uncertain how long he was detained, but he eventually returned to Manila and re-established himself as owner and proprietor of Botica de Santa Cruz.





In 1945, after World War II, Don Toribio M Teodoro, the founder of Ang Tibay Shoes, bought the company from Carlos Jährling. After Toribio Teodoro's death in 1965, management of Botica de Santa Cruz was passed down to his youngest daughter, Josephina Teodoro Tiongson, and his son-in-law Dr Antonio Т Tiongson. The company currently trades as The Pharmedic Corporation. Botica de Santa Cruz is the second oldest drug company still in business today (oldest being Botica Boie) and acknowledged as the ninth oldest company by the Department of Trade and Industry.

Dr Carlos Jährling

Born: January 8, 1876 – Manila Parents: German Father, Filipino Mother Wife: Anna Jährling THE PHARMEDIC CORPORATION Botica de Santa Cruz ESTABLISHED 1861

GALISATUM was a skin ointment developed by Dr Carlos Jährling of Botica de Santa Cruz in the 1930s. "Galis" was an all-encompassing local term for any skin conditions - from scabies, eczema to skin chafing and mange. "Atum" was a suffix that was commonly used in pharmaceutical products like "mentholatum" and "petrolatum".

<u>Angel Island Immigration Station</u>: Located in Marin County, San Francisco, USA. Detention and Processing centre for 'Alien Enemies' during World War I. Defined by Presidential Proclamation of April 6, 1917, alien enemies were noncitizen males over the age of 14 born in Germany and, as of December 1917, born in the Austro-Hungarian Empire. Only in mid-April 1918 were women declared to be alien enemies, a category some fell into through marriage or through their fathers. The alien enemies detained at Angel Island fell into several groups: seamen working on German ships, seamen working on American ships, German nationals residing in the Philippines (then an American territory), ships' passengers born in enemy countries, and resident aliens.
