
DOMINGO BURGOS DY-YANCO

Domingo Burgos Dy-Yanco (also referenced as Dy-Yangco) was of Chinese decent, being one of the early Chinese immigrants to Cebu in the 1860s. While the Chinese immigrants were engaged in abaca production and in operating small retail stores, some of them, including Domingo Burgos, would later improve their lot and become wealthy merchants. In order to be assimilated into Cebuano society, he converted to the Catholic faith, providing him with certain economic and social advantages. Records show Domingo Burgos as a Comerciantes (Merchant) in Cebu between 1892 and 1895.
