The earliest records show Enrique Spitz working in1888 as a merchant with his office located at Escolta 8, Manila, supported by F Rauch and B v Slernenfels. The company continued to operate from the same location up to 1903. In addition, Enrique was a stamp collector and dealer with listings in the Philatelistisches Andressbuch in 1896 and the International Philatelic Collectors Directory in 1898. He is linked, along with fellow philatelist Julio Madurga, to the production of the Zamboanga Provisional stamps issued in 1898. It is understood that the stamps were overprinted on the night of 12 August 1898, the day before the surrender of Manila to the Americans, and the stamps subsequently sent to Zamboanga where they were reportedly placed in use.

From 1901 to 1916, Enrique Spitz was agent for the Mannheim Insurance Company, Mannheim, Germany. In 1904, the company Schmidt & Ziegler became Successors to Enrique Spitz, located at Escolta 42, Manila and operating as General Import and Export Merchants. The parent company was managed by C Moritz Schmidt and Karl Ziegler, with head office located in Remscheid, Germany, where they both resided. Between 1904 and 1908, the Manila operations was managed by Roberto Greuling and Karl Ziegler Jr. In 1908 the company moves premises to Calle David 64, Manila and again to Calle David 244 in 1917.

No further records have been found after 1917. It is more than likely the operations ceased as part of the outbreak of World War I where the company was seized under the Trading with the Enemy Act of 1917. The Act gave the President the power to control trade with enemies during wartime. The Act was passed on 6 October 1917, in response to the US declaration of war on Germany on 6 April 1917. The Act established the Office of Alien Property Custodian which was given the power to seize, manage and sell property (including businesses) owned by US enemies.



Records show the ship was conducting manoeuvres around Manila Bay between June 12 and August 12, 1898 and again between August 21 and September 2, 1898.






