Filipis/31" double-ring arrival d.s., splitting along folds, very fine and scarce usage (10 cuartos double-weight interior rate). Scott 10.

Only four covers recorded with this adhesive. Scott 73.

With the adoption of U.P.U. rates on 1 September 1879, four King Alfonso XII "Convenio Universal de Correos Habilitado" surcharges were issued that day for the new rates.

1948-90 unmounted mint collection of definitive or regular issues, with some later sets in blocks of four or six, including 1948-52 K.G.VI 1c. to \$5 in both perf. 14 and perf. 17½ x 18, 1955-59 Q.E.II 1c. to \$5, 1968-73 1c. to \$10 (including perf. 13 set of seven), fresh, the K.G.VI perf. 17½ x 18 set has some light foxing or rust on reverse (customary on these sets from Asia) and the perf. 14 \$5 has single foxed perf. tip on reverse, fine to very fine; also included are 1989, 1990, 1991 (3), 1992-1994 stamp year books (approx. 300 exclusive of year books).
