

PHILIPPINE PHILATELY - A CHALLENGE

In this day and age of commercialized philately, wherein every country tends to issue stamps more for the collectors rather than for the mailing public, collecting stamps per se becomes more of a habit by hobbyists and investments by non-collectors. The real fun and satisfaction of collecting stamps is lost along the way due to over enthusiasm and commercialism of both dealers and postal authorities. Therefore, to find a devoted student of philately who collects more for fun and knowledge is becoming more of a rare specie than ever before.

Take for example Philippine Philately. The growth of Philippine Philately continually increased from the very first time that the very first Philippine postage stamp was issued in 1854 and peaked during the mid-1920's and during the Japanese Occupation. Right after the war, a few interested collectors tried to resurrect what was the situation before, only to see it collapsed in the later part of the 1950's. Philippine Philately was actually dying by the time the IPPS was formed. With the birth of the IPPS, the few devoted students of Philippine postal history got the chance to group together again, this time coming from all over the world, as collectors in the Philippines simply neglected Philippine Philately in favor of other country and/or topical collections. What started as a mere "get together society", IPPS is now the recognized leader whose members' efforts are purely for the love of Philippine Philately rather than its commercialization.

Sad to say, we have more serious collectors of Philippine Philately abroad than in our own country. Surely, we have those who collect merely for the sake of collecting and nothing more; and those who collect merely for the monetary profit of it. To find a serious student of Philippine Philately in the Philippines today is very difficult and this you can probably count in one hand.

What one does not realize is the vast areas of Philippine Philately he can indulge in a most challenging and mind boggling studies, particularly in search of elusive postal history materials and and unrecorded varieties.

No less than IPPS president, Gene Garrett, has, for the past ten years, devoted so much time and efforts in the study of Philippine Japanese Occupation issues, not only with regards to the basic stamps and FDCs, but going much deeper into its postal history such as postmarks, censor marks and labels, errors and varieties, special cancels, spe-

cial issues, postal stationeries, significant dates, etc. . . . Mr. Garrett's handbook of this period, a much awaited piece of work, will surely be a welcome piece and a great boost to Philippine Philately.

We have other study groups in the making, such as Philippine Spanish postmarks, Revolutionary Period issues, Revenue and Stamped Papers, etc.... One thing noticeable though is that, all these studies are of pre-Republic (1946) era. How about our Republic or current issues and postal history? Who are studying these and recording them for history's sake and for the future students of Philippine Philately? This is a question that remains unanswered now, but hopefully, will not remain unanswered soon.

I am therefore putting up a challenge to the now-collectors, the young collectors of today. Our forefathers have done their part - the likes of Arnold Warren, Mencarini, Bruggmann, Palmer, Esperidion and Cacho. Of course today we have Gene Garrett, Ray Coughlin and Bill Oliver from the USA, and Mario Que and Dr. Ngo Tiong Tak from the Philippines. It is now in our hands more than ever to continue what these great people of Philippine Philately have done and is doing to show future generations of Philippine Philatelists what we, the contemporary collectors of today, has done to keep Philippine Philately alive.

There are many interesting fields of studies of Philippine Republic issues on specialized level. Your editor, with the help of fellow member Mario Que has several projects going on to record some areas of Philippine Republic postal history. We have started works on the Republic Flight Covers, Postal Slogans, Postmarks, and Revenues. Any help is welcome and will be appreciated.

One of the studies done and which will be updated as new information is obtained, is the Republic Errors, Freaks and Oddities. This is the subject of this extensive issue of the PPN, a compilation of the whole of 1980 issues. We hope that through this study, one will find why Republic Stamps are as interesting to collect as any others. There's fun, knowledge, and satisfaction.

ERROS, FREAKS, and ODDITIES ON PHILIPPINE STAMPS BY DR. NGO TIONG TAK, LINDA STANFIELD MARIO QUE

Most collectors have heard of fantastic errors and varieties, if they don't own some themselves. We have all read about the U.S. inverted centers which are each worth a fortune, and we have also seen pictures of other famous errors as well, and most of these are listed in catalogues. For the Philippines, we see a number of errors listed for pre-Republic stamps, but only very few of the known errors on the Republic series appear in any catalogue. This gives catalogue users the impression that there are but a few recognized errors and many will not accept unlisted errors as genuine.

Advanced Philippine collectors know that there exists quite a number of genuine errors and varieties on Republic issues although most remain unlisted in catalogues. This is why there has long been a great need for a really comprehensive listing of all such errors and varieties. Since it's so difficult to delineate an error from a variety, a comprehensive listing needs to include everything that is different in some ways from the normal.

Most philatelists will consider a stamp to be an ERROR where there is an omission of color or perforation; when a color or overprint is printed more than once, or inverted; when the printing is on the wrong side of the paper or on a wrong type of paper. All other mistakes, no matter how dramatic are considered VARIETIES only. Many varieties occur constantly on all or part of a printing, due to a mistake on the printing plate. Other varieties occur due to a misalignment or shift of some colors or perforations; others come about as a result of some paper creases or folds. In some instances, these result in very dramatic changes in the appearance of the stamps, therefore, philatelists give all these varieties that are not considered errors the term "FREAKS AND ODDITIES."

Errors, freaks and oddities (EFO's) occur naturally during any printing process, including stamp printing. However, all such "imperfect" stamps are supposed to be removed and destroyed and not allowed to reach the public. Most postal authorities do their utmost to ensure that such "imperfect" stamps do not get out of the printing plants and/or post offices, and all stamps are carefully checked before they are sold. Unfortunately (but fortunately for collectors?) even with the strictest measures taken there will still be some EFO's that will slip thru the inspection. Some postal authorities rely solely on the printers for the inspection of their stamps and because some security printers have so many jobs, they couldn't care less if a few of the stamps they print have minor mistakes after

they give them what they consider adequate inspection. So, on stamps of many countries, notably the U.S. and Great Britain, we read about all kinds of EFO's on almost each new stamp. Sometimes ten or more different types of errors can be found on a single stamp. This leads many to believe that many such errors are intentional or came out thru the "back door"; but, if you compare the number of errors with the total quantities printed, you will realize that the printers and inspectors are really doing a good job. Besides, what human being can be so perfect as to detect each and every EFO when checking millions of stamps. And, as EFO collecting becomes more popular, more and more collectors become aware of such imperfections, and they will all be scrutinizing each and every stamp that come their way. Thus, you can be sure of more EFO's found and reported now than there used to be.

The following listing of EFO's on Philippine Republic stamps may appear to be very long and there seems to be an EFO listed for almost every one of the newer locally printed stamps. However, compared with other countries, there are but a very few major errors on our stamps. Since the quality of printing process at the Bureau of Printing and APO-NEDA cannot compare with those abroad, our inspectors must already be doing a good job at weeding out the imperfect stamps. Nevertheless, some EFO's are still expected to be over-looked, and probably some may have been noticed, such as offsets or slight color or perforation shifts, but in order to avoid wastage, they just were not removed and destroyed and were sold to the public as a regular stamp.

The listing we have come up with are what the authors have actually seen for they are either from their own personal collections or in the collection of other collectors. There should be many others, and we plan to report all yet unlisted ones in future issues of PPN, However, we have to examine the actual stamps carefully. This is now very imperative especially after so many so-called "missing color" or "change of color" errors have surfaced here not too long ago. The authors have examined a lot of such chemically-treated or otherwise manufactured errors, mostly on missing colors and changed of colors, especially whom it involves the colors red and gold, which are the two easiest colors to "lift" or "remove". Fortunately, all these fakes can still be easily detected by close scrutiny and careful comparison with normal stamps and with pure simple common sense.

The authors have been in correspondence with Stanley Gibbons of England, and they are satisfied with the errors submitted for their examination. Therefore, Philippine collectors will very soon see almost all of the genuine major errors listed in the forthcoming Stanley Gibbons Part 21 (South East Asia) catalogue. This recognition of our errors by one of the most prestigious catalogues in the world should make them even more worthwhile collecting. Of course, Gibbons cannot list other varieties, no matter how good they may be, because their foreign catalogues are not of a specialized nature. It is up to us Philippine specialists to record the rest, so that all collectors will know what exist and what to look for.

Collecting EFO's can be very rewarding. Aside from constant varieties, most exist in very limited quantities, many with only one sheet found, while others are unique. Therefore, by adding EFO's to one's Republic collection, not only will it become more valuable, but it will be different and special and therefore, make it more "attractive" to others; more will be interested to look at a collection with EFO's than a straight-forward complete Re-

public collection, which practically everybody has. In fact, no two collections with a lot of EFO's can be exactly alike. The important thing is to know what you want and what you are buying. At the moment, there are still very few serious collectors of EFO's but soon when more collectors got tired of the regular Republic issues, the increased demand forsthese interesting items should cause prices to go up and many good EFO's will just disappear into collections and will subsequently be offered infrequently.

At this point, we want to acknowledge the different reference books we used in bringing about this study, and these are: APS Fundamental of Philately, Stanley Gibbons various catalogues, Musson Stamp Dictionary, Linn's World Stamp Almanac, Rush Stamps catalog on Errors and Varieties, and Postage Stamp Catalogue of Hongkong.

Since this is a first attemp at listing all known EFO's of the Republic issues, we feel we should at least give an explanation of some of the terms used to describe each item:

FLAW — any blemish in the stamp design resulting from or occasioned by the process of printing.

ACCORDION — flaws due to printing on creased paper.

ADDITIONAL PRINTING ON THE RE-VERSE — a stamp that bears a print of part of the design on the back. It differs from offset in that the printing reads normally from left to right and could have become printed on both sides if complete design appears.

BLANKET OFFSET — stamps with double or partially double print which is due to adjustment of the printing press' blanket during the early stages of printing.

DOCTOR BLADE FLAW — flaws due to faulty wiping of the ink on the printing cylinder; appears as white or colored lines of varying width and generally extend over several stamps.

DOUBLE IMPRESSION — a stamp that exhibits linear duplication in all or some parts of the design, irrespective of the cause of such duplication.

DRY PRINT — a stamp exhibiting uncolored lines, spots or other areas caused by wet printing upon paper insufficiently dampened.

LITHO FLAW — this is due to specks of dust setting on the plate which prevents the ink from reaching the area, leaving a white inkless portion. Minor flecks of colors are similarly caused. Such flaws only affect part of a printing and cannot be regarded as constant.

PERFORATION SHIFTED AND SLANTED — most sheets with dramatic shift of either vertical or horizontal perforation will produce stamps with incomplete designs and white spaces on the outer rows. Sometimes, marginal inscriptions and markings become part of the "stamp" due to the shift.

PRINTING BOTH SIDES — a stamp that bears a print of the design on the front and back of the paper. Both impressions must, of course, be normal in the sense that they read from left to right.

OFFSET — an additional unintended impression or part impression of the stamp design on the face or back of a stamp, caused by wet printing ink coming into contact with the surface that bears the additional impression. Appears most commonly at the back of a stamp and the most frequent cause is that the sheet has been forced into close contact with another sheet of freshly printed stamps before the ink is dry. The design appears reversed that is, it reads from right to left, instead of from left to right.


