MULTI-PURPOSE TICKETS

This article presents a table and illustrations of five multi-purpose tickets. After that, little is known on these rare fiscals. Shown are Figure 1, 20c Lipa City, Batangas; Figure 2, l0c Gattaran, Cagayan; Figure 3, 50c Alcala, Cagayan; and Figure 4, 20c Ilagan, Isabela. All are used except for the 10 centavos Type I ticket. The value and seal are in color, all other printing is black ink. These three provinces are all on Luzon Island but apart from each other located in the Northeast and Southwest.

Figure 5 shows Figure I on document. This is the only recorded document of this series that formerly belonged to Abe Luspo, Jr. It is a Certificate of Transfer of Large Cattle, dated March 5, 1927 with the seal of "SECRETARIA MUNICIPAL DE LIPA / BATANGAS P." The purpose and date is not punched on this ticket but most likely is SLAUGHTER when the animal was sold/ transferred for food. However, there is the possibility the animal was sold for farm use and the MARKET block would then apply.

Figure 4 was a ferry use. The illustration shows the name "Rio Muento Ferry" on the reverse which may have been the name of the Magat river in Ilagan sometime in the past. The 20c Type II Cagayan example is black on black and belongs to Nemi Rivera. The 20c Isabela example is purple on black and belongs to the author. I assume that for the 20c stamps, that Type I is purple and Type II is black. The author owns the ones with the bold X and has a photocopy or reports on those with a lighter X mark. Nemi Rivera also owns the Type II, 10c Cagayan example. Both of Nemi's examples are used as ferry tickets.

The author wishes that collectors with additional example notify him or the editor.




- 19) "REGISTER INSURE ALL -VALUABLE MAIL." Flag Boxed type. Slogan in 4 lines, Earliest date seen, March 1, 1924. Also used in 1925 and 1926.
- 20) "BUY MONEY ORDER DO NOT SEND CUR-RENCY - BY - SPECIAL DELIVERY - OR - ORDINARY MAIL." Flag-Boxed type. Slogan in 6 lines. Earliest date seen, March 10, 1924. Also used in 1925.
- 21) "POST ADDRESS YOUR MAIL EARLY CLEARLY." Flag -Boxed type. Slogan in 3 lines. Earliest date seen. Aug. 1/24. Also used in 1925 and 1926.
- 22) "JOIN THE RED CROSS -(Sign of Red Cross)." Flag-Boxed type. Slogan in 3 lines. Earliest date seen, Nov. 7/24

- 23) "BUY IDENTIFICATION CARD." Flag-Boxed type, Slogan in 3 lines. Earliest date seen, Sept. 17/24. Also used in 1925 and 1926.
- 24)"MANILA CARNIVAL--COMMERCIAL FAIR FEB. 7-15-1925." Flag-Exposition cancel. Slogan in 3 lines. Earliest date seen. Jan. 13/25. Note: This is Type II. (For Type I, see No. 16).
- 25) "DEPOSIT YOUR FUNDS WITH THE POSTAL-SAVINGS BANK" Flag Boxed type. Slogan in 4 lines. Earliest date seen, June 11/25. Also used in 1926.
- 26) "ADDRESS YOUR MAIL TO BARRIO OR SITIO." Flag -Boxed type. Slogan in 4 lines. Earliest date seen, Sept. 10/25
- 27) "CAPIZ PETIT CARNIVAL- DEC. 8-12, 1925." Flag-Exposition slogan. Slogan in two lines and applied in purple, by hand-stamp. Also town mark but in black. Used in Capiz, Capiz. Earliest date seen, Dec. 3/25.
- 28) "MANILA CARNIVAL-COMMERCIAL FAIR Jan. 30-FEB. 14 1926." Flag-Exposition cancel. Earliest date seen, Dec. 12/25. Also used in Jan. 1926. Note: This is Type III. (Types I and II, see Nos. 16 and 24, respectively).
- 29) "JOIN THE RED CROSS (Sign of Red Cross)." Boxed type Slogan in 2 lines. And before the dial. Earliest date seen Nov 5/21. This is the first slogan cancel of the Philippines with the slogan before the dial.

- 30) "REGISTER-INSURE-ALL-VALUABLE MAIL. "Straightline with Grid Handstamp. Slogan in 5 lines, unboxed. On the left is a handstamped townmark and on the right is a barrel-killer in 5 heavy horizontal bars. Earliest date seen, Oct. 11/24. Also used in 1925. Note: This is a combined slogan townmark cancel.
- 31) "MANILA, PI. APR. 7 -1130 AM 1925 ADDRESS MAIL- TO STREET AND NUMBER." Straightline with Grid Handstamp. Combined slogan-townmark with a small barrel-killer in 9 heavy horizontal bars, on the right. Slogan in 8 lines. Earliest date seen, Apr. 7/25. Also used in 1926.
- 32) "CEBU, P.I. 1 PM SEPT. 23, 1925 ADDRESS MAIL TO STREET AND NUMBER." Straightline with Grid Handstamp. Combined slogan-townmark with a small barrel-killer in 9 heavy horizontal lines on the right. Slogan in 7 lines. Earliest date seen. Sept. 23/25. Also used in 1926 and 1933.
- 33) "MANILA TRADE CENTER OF THE PACIFIC." Straightline with Grid Handstamp. Combined slogan-townmark with a barrel-killer in 10 heavy horizontal bars on the right. Slogan in 5 lines and "CENTER" in acrostic arrangement. Earliest date seen, July 3/25.
- 34) "ABARGAN ANG MASIGLANG PAG -- SISIKAP SA PAGTITIPID." Straightline type--Handstamp. Plain slogan. Legend in Tagalog, in 2 lines. Applied in red. Translation of slogan into English is: "Watch for the national thrift campaign." Slogan used in Lucena, Ta-yabas. Earliest date seen, July 3/27.
- 35) "MAKISALI SA KILUSAN SAPAG TITIPID." Straightline type Handstamp. Plain slogan. Legend in Tagalog in 2 lines. Applied in purple. English translation: "Join the thrift campaign." Slogan used in Santa Cruz. Laguna. Earliest date seen, Aug. 20/27.

36) "MAGTIPID KAYO AT HUWAG MAG - AKSAYA SA ANU- MANG PARAAN." Straightline type 1 -Handstamp. Plain slogan. Legend in Tagalog in 2 lines. Applied in red. English translation: "Save and don't waste in any way." Slogan used by the Manila Post Office. Earliest date seen, Oct. 21/27.

- 37) "IDULINMO DAGITI URNONGMO TI AYOAN ITI BANGKO ITI KOREO." Straightline type Handstamp. Plain slogan. Legend in Ilocano in 2 lines. Applied in purple. English translation: "Deposit your savings at the Postal Savings Bank." Slogan used in Laoag, Ilocos Norte. Earliest date seen, Sept. 19/28.
- 38) "MAG DAMUT QUITA PAKA ABOT NA ALDAO."
 Straightline type Handstamp. Plain slogan. Legend in Bicol in 2 lines. Applied in purple. English translation: "Let us save for the rainy day." Slogan used in Legaspi, Albay. Earliest date seen, Dec. 28/27.
- 39) "TUMABANG KA SA PAGPAGONO HIN PAGTIMOS SA SAIMONG MGA KAIRUBA." Straightline type Handstamp. Plain slogan. Legend in Bicol in 3 lines. Applied in purple. English translation: "Help in propagating the thrift campaign in your community." Slogan used Rapu Rapu, Albay. Earliest date seen, July 28/28.
- 40) "GASTOHA ANG INYONG SAPI SA MAAYON PAAGL" Straightline type Handstamp. Plain slogan. Legend in Visayan in 2 lines. Applied in purple. English translation: "Spend your money wisely." Slogan used in Surigao, Surigao. Earliest date seen. Sept. 24/27.
- 41) "TUMULONG KAYONG MAPALAGA NAP ANG DIWA NG PAGTITIPID SA INYONG LIPUNAN." Straightline type Handstamp. Plain slogan. Legend in Tagalog in 3 lines. Applied in purple. English translation: "Help in promoting the thrift drive in your community." Slogan used in Lobo, Eatangas. Earliest date seen, July 6/28.
- 42) "LUMAYO KAYO SA MGA MASASAMANG PANU-KALA ERG MGA TAUHAN - AT LIPUNANG PANGSAMAN-TALA LA - MANG RG SALAPI." Straightline type -Handstamp

Plain slogan. Legend in Tagalog in 4 lines. Applied in red. English translation: "Beware of rackets and racketeers." Slogan used in Calapan, Mindoro. Earliest date seen, Dec. 11/28.

- 43) "WATCH FOR NATIONAL THRIFT CAMPAIGN- ABARGAN ANG MASIGLANG PAG -SISIKAP SA PAGTITIPID." Straightline type Handstamp. Plain slogan. Legend in English and Tagalog in 4 lines. Applied in red. Slogan used by the Manila Post Office. Earliest date seen, July 11/27.
- 44) "SPEND YOUR MONEY WISELY. ISIPING MABUTI ANG PAGGUGU GOL RG SALAPI. Straightline type Handstamp. Legend in English and Tagalog in 3 lines. Applied in red. Slogan used by the Manila Post Office. Earliest date seen, Sept. 15/27.
- 45) "DO NOT IMITATE THE RICH LIVE WITHIN YOUR IN-COME." Straightline type - Handstamp Plain slogan in 2 lines. Applied in red. Slogan used by the Manila Post Office. Earliest date seen, Oct. 5/28.
- 46) "SAN PABLO CARNIVAL -AND LAGUNA PROVINCIAL FAIR April 11-16-17, 1928." Straightline type Handstamp Plain slogan in 4 lines. Applied in purple. Used in San Pablo, Laguna Earliest date seen, March 12/28.
- 47) "SAN JUAN DE LETRAN -TRI-CENTENNIAL DEC. 18-21, 1930." Boxed type Handstamp. Slogan in 3 lines, in purple. Earliest date seen, Nov. 11/30.
- 48) "MANILA TRADE CENTER OF THE PACIFIC." Universal type. Type I. Slogan in 4 lines. First day use July 12/30. Also used in 1931 to 1941. Note: Type 1 bears the dial with "P. I."; Type 1a shows two breaks on the left vertical frame of the rectangle enclosing the slogans; Type 11 has "PHILIPPINES" instead of the "P. I." at the bottom inside the dial. It was used

- in 1939. Type II a is identical to Type I a.
- 49) "POST YOUR MAIL -EARLY." Universal type. Type I. Slogan in 3 lines. Earliest date seen, Aug. 31/31. Also used in 1932 to 1944 and early in 1945. Of the Universal types, this was the only machine slogan cancel used during the Jap Occupation, with March 4/42, as it's First Day Use. and the last day, Feb. 3/44, Liberation of Manila by the U.S. Armed Forces. Note: -Known to exist with 4 types identical to No. 49.
- 50) "REMIT ...-YOUR MONEY-BY MONEY ORDER." Universal type. Type I. Slogan in 4 lines. Earliest date seen, July 28/31. Also used up to 1941. Note: In 4 types identical to No. 48.
- bl) "HELP PREVENT TUBERCULOSIS P.I. ANTI-TUBERCULOSIS - SOCIETY." Universal type. Slogan in 4 lines. Earliest date Seen, Sept. 17/31. Also used in 1933.
- 52) "REGISTER VALUABLE MAIL." Universal type. Type I. Slogan in 3 lines. Earliest date seen, Sept. 22/23. Also used up to 1941. Note: In 4 types identical to No. 48.
- 53) "RED CROSS (Sign of Cross) ROLL CALL JOIN." Universal type. Type I. Slogan in 4 lines. First day use, Nov. 1/31. Also used up to 1941. Note: In 4 types identical to No. 48.
- 54) "MAKE EVERY DAY CHILD HEALTH DAY." Universal type. Type I. Slogan in 4 lines. Earliest date seen, Sept. 1/31. Also used in 1936 to 1938. Note: Exists in two types, I and 1a.
- 55) "PROTECT HOME INDUSTRY BUY PHILIPPINE -. MADE PRODUCTS." Universal type. Type I. Slogan in 3 lines. First day use., Aug. 17/33. Also used up to 1941. Note: Exists in two types, I and I a.
- 56) "BUY NATIONAL CHARITY SWEEPSTAKE TICK-ETS" (with a double-barred cross before and after the word "BUY"). Universal type. Type 1. Slogan in 4 lines. First day use.

- "BUY"). Universal type. Type 1. Slogan in 4 lines. First day use. Aug. 1/34. Also used up to 1941. Note: Exists in two types, I and I a.
- 57) "TENTH FAR EASTERN CHAMPIONSHIP GAMES MANILA, MAY 12-19, 1934." Universal type. Slogan in 3 lines. First day use, April 24/33. Also used in 1934.
- 58) "NATIONAL BOOK WEEK -JUNE 18-24 READ GOOD BOOKS." Universal type. Type I. Slogan in 3 lines. First day use, June 18/34. Also used in 1935. Note: -Type II bears no month, date and year. It was used in 1938 to 1940.
- 59) "LET'S GO TO PRESIDENT QUEZON'S BIRTHDAY ON AUGUST 19. 1935." Universal type Type I. Slogan in 5 lines. Earliest date seen, Aug. 6/35.
- 60) "LET'S GO TO PRESIDENT OUEZON'S BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION AUGUST 19, 1935." Universal type. Type II. Slogan in 5 lines. Earliest date seen, July 15/35.
- 61) "2nd NATIONAL CONGRESS OF FILIPINO BUSINESS-MEN NOVEMBER 19-22, 1935." Universal type. Slogan in 3 lines. First day use, Nov. 1/35.
- 62) "PAY YOUR INTERNAL REVENUE TAXES ON TIME." Universal type. Type I. Slogan in 3 lines. First day use, Jan. 5/36. Used in 1936 only.
- 63) "PAY YOUR INTERNAL --REVENUE TAXES ON TIME." Universal type. Type II. Slogan in 3 lines. Earliest date seen, Oct. 11/36. Also used up to 1941. Note: Type II a exists, identical to Type IIa in No. 48.
- 64) "SAFE DRIVING +- SANE WALKING ACCIDENT PRE-VENTION." Universal type--Boxed. Slogan in 4 lines. Earliest date seen, April 26/36. Also used up to 1941.

- 65) "AVOID ACCIDENTS -DRIVE WALK CAREFULLY." Universal type Boxed. Slogan in 4 lines. Earliest date seen, April 21/36. Also used up to 1941.
- 66) "XXXIII INTERNATIONAL.EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS FEB. 2-7, 1937 MANILA, PHILIPPINES." Universal type Boxed. Slogan in 4 lines. Earliest date seen, March 25/36.
- 67) "INAUGURATION CITY OF ILOILO JULY 16, 1937." Boxed type Handstamp. Slogan in 3 lines, in purple. Townmark by handstamp in black. Used in Iloilo City, July 16/37. Note: This is a plain slogan and not slogan cancel.
- 68) "OBSERVE-CHILD HEALTH DAY SEPTEMBER 1, 1936." Universal type. Slogan in 3 lines. Earliest date seen, Aug. 1/36.
- 69) "30th ANNIVERSARY-UNIVERSITY OF THE PHILIP-PINES 1908-1938." Universal type. Slogan in 4 lines. Earliest date seen, June 22/38.
- 70) "BOY SCOUT ANNIVERSARY PERIOD OCTOBER 31 NOVEMBER 15." Universal type. Slogan in 3 lines. First day use, Oct. 29/38. Also used up to 1941.
- 71) "NATIONAL BOOK WEEK READ GOOD BOOKS." Universal type. Type II. Slogan in 2 lines. Earliest date seen, Nov. 24/38. Also used up to 1940. Note: For type I, see No. 58).
- 72) "REMIT YOUR MONEY BY- MONEY ORDER." Universal type. Slogan in 3 lines. Used in Cebu City. Earliest date seen. Dec. 21/40. Also used up to 1941. Note: Prior to the use of this machine slogan cancel in Cebu City, the Cebu Post Office was using a machine cancel with the year "1935" plus seven horizontal lines utilized as a stampkiller. In subsequent years until 1938, the same machine cancel went into use but the years which were changed accordingly.

- 73) "JOIN THE VOLUNTEER. --- GUARD." Universal type. Type I. Slogan in 3 lines. First day use, June 18/41. Used for one and half months only. Known to exist with Type 1 a.
- 74) "KEEP 'EM FLYING." Universal type. Type I. Slogan in 2 lines. First day use, Aug. 5/41. Used for 3 months only. Two types exist. Type I bears the slogan with thin letters, while Type II, letters are bold and two breaks are indicated on the left vertical frame of the rectangle enclosing the slogan. This slogan cancel was suggested personally by the writer in an open letter in the "Open Forum" of the Manila Daily Bulletin, July 17/41.
- 75) "MAKE EVERY HOME AN ARSENAL OF FOOD." Universal type. Slogan in 2 lines. First day use, Nov. 17/41. Used for one month only.
- 76) "PRODUCE AND PRESERVE FOOD FOR NATIONAL DEFENSE." Universal type. Slogan in 3 lines. First day use, Nov. 18/41. Used for one month only.
- 77) "POST YOUR MAIL -EARLY." Universal type. Type 1. Slogan in 3 lines. First day use, March 4/42. Also used in 1943, 1944 and early in 1945. Note: This was the only prewar machine slogan cancel used during the Jap Occupation. Last day use, Feb. 3/45. Liberation of Manila by the U.S. Armed Forces.
- 78) "POSTAL SAVINGS BANK Deposit your savings with the local postmaster.
- 79) "POSTAL SAVINGS BANK Thrift takes you up the ladder, waste brings you down."
- 80) "POSTAL SAVINGS BANK He that will not econo-mize, will have to -agonize." "Straightline type Handstamp. Plain slogans. Each of the above 3 slogans is in 4 lines, the first line all in caps and underscored, and the rest in caps -and lower cases. Applied first in purple and later in black. First day use, Aug. 5/43. Used for about a month only.




