




2 Centavos Rizal. Engraved and printed by the U.S. Bureau of Engraving and Printing, Washington, D.C..

The cards were issued in October 1929.


Quantity issued: 1,498,020 cards.




Mint cards, printed in yellow green and the card stock used is rather amber color.



Aparri, Cagayan 18 May 1931, to Chicago, United States of America.




Manila 28 March 1931, to Habana, Cuba.
Habana receiving cancel on back, 23 April 1931.



Bacolod, Negros Occidental 13 February 1932, to Santa Cruz, Republic of Bolivia.

Both cards were franked at the special rate of 4 Centavos according to the American-Spanish Postal Congress.

Both destinations are scarce.



Manila 12 June 1941, to Butler, United States of America.



Carcar, Cebu 24 February 1941, to Meire, Kingdom of Belgium.
German censor mark from Berlin applied on front.

These cards remained in use until the beginning of the Japanese occupation, although a new series of cards was issued from 1936.
