

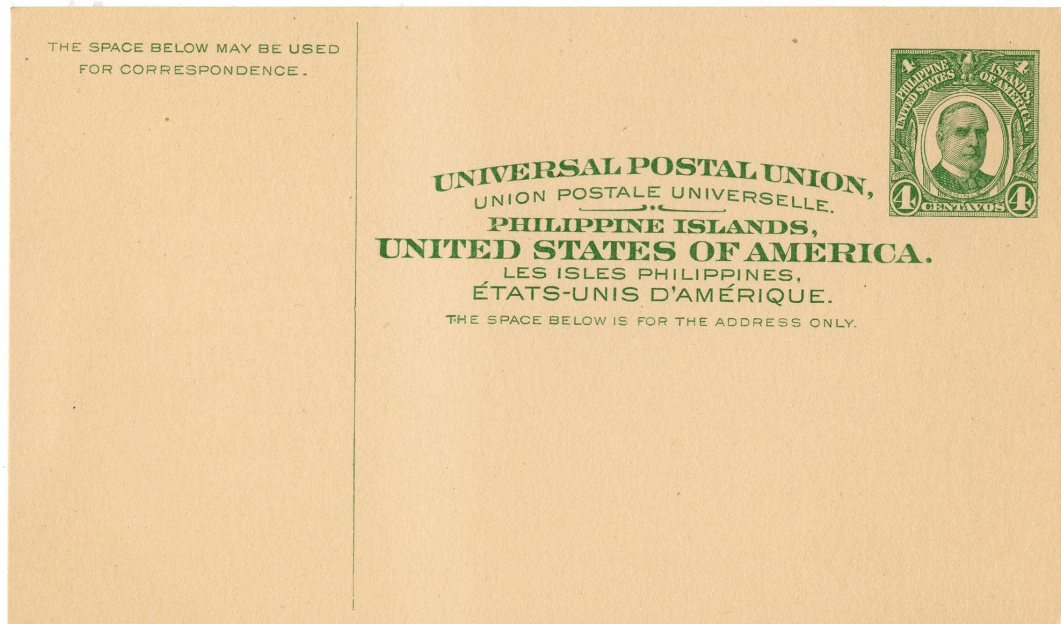

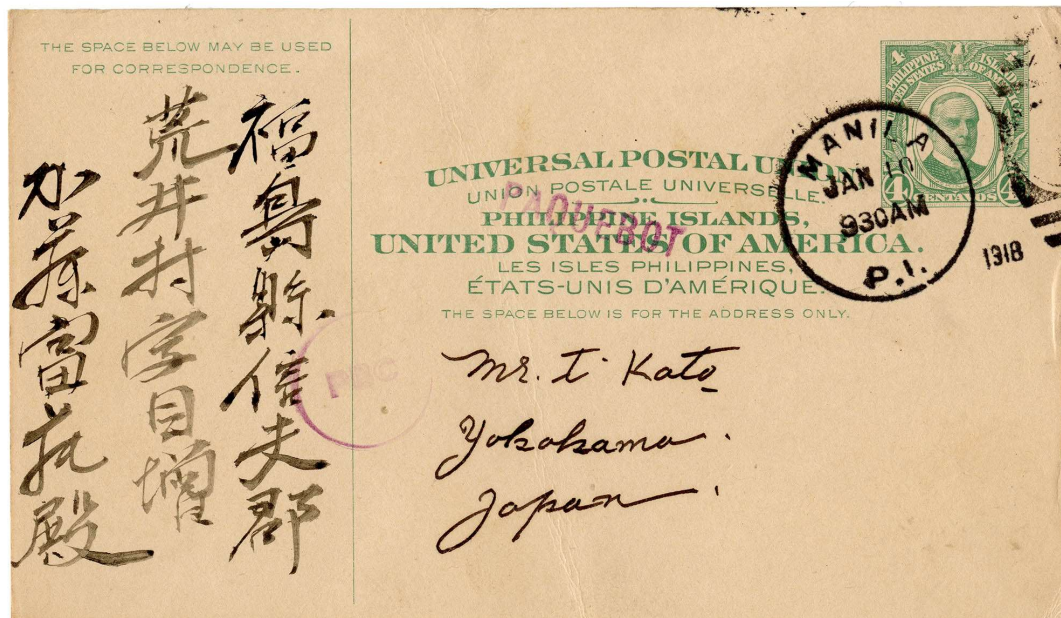
4 Centavos McKinley, designed for UPU mailing. Engraved and printed by the U.S. Bureau of Engraving and Printing, Washington, D.C..

The cards were issued in July 1916.

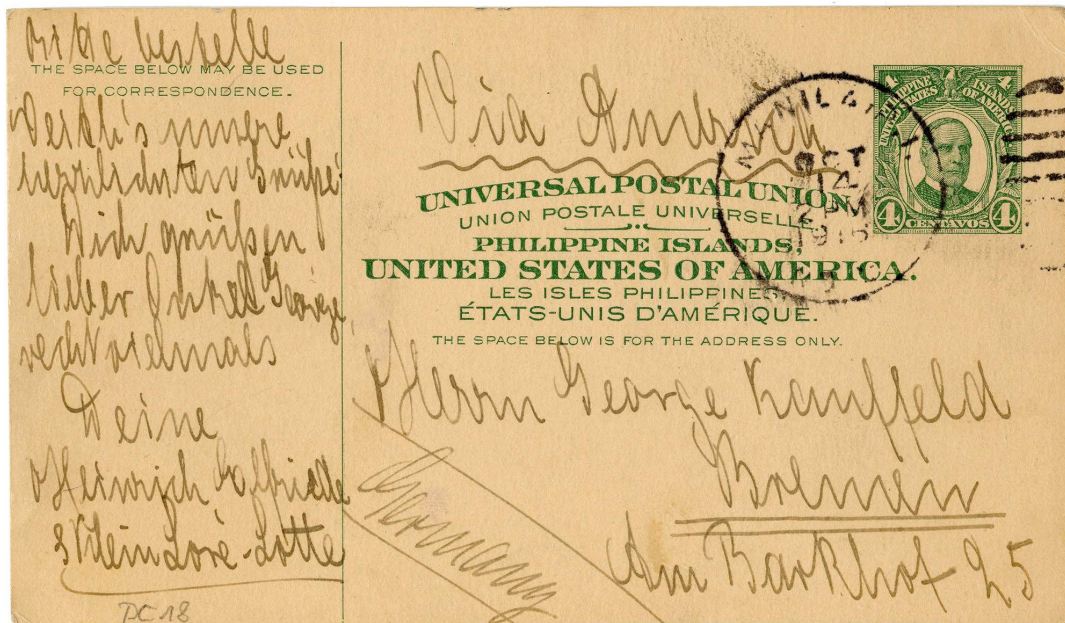
Quantity issued: 484,400 cards.

Sent in Davao, Mindanao and cancelled in Manila 10 January 1918, to Yokohama, Japan. In Manila, a "PAQUEBOT" mark was applied. According to UPU agreements, mail items posted in a harbor or on a ship should be marked this way. Furthermore, the postcard was also censored on its way to Japan.



Manila 14 October 1916, to Bremen, German Empire.
Sent eastwards "Via America" due to wartime disruptions.



Bacolod, Negros Occidental 24 October 1927, to Dorset, United Kingdom.
Postal thrift slogan applied to the front, "IPITAGO ANG SINOPTAN MO / NGA PILAK SA BANCO", translating in
Negros to "Deposit your savings in the bank", **scarce marking**.
