Used Between 1802 - 1839. Measuring 46 mm.

MANILA to GUATEMALA

Via ACAPULCO - CALLO DE LIMA - GUAYAQUIP - CAPE HORN

Carried by the Real Compañia de Filipinas galleon "El Rey" (Purisima Concepcion). Per maritime records, left Manila for Cadiz, January 1803.

Originally rated "3.P." (Reales de Plata), changed to "4.U." (Reales de Vellon). Corrected to "6.U." for non Spanish destination rate.

Black **"MANILA"** in Fancy Oval Used Only in 1820

1820 JUNE 24: MANILA to MEXICO

Via ACAPULCO

Carried by the ship "Aventurero".

Rated with manuscript "4" Reales de Plata upon arrival in Mexico.

1821 FEBRUARY 2: CANTON to SAN SEBASTIAN

Via MANILA - CALCUTTA - CAPE OF GOOD HOPE

Endorsed "Por El Navio (El Rey) Fernando", the other name for the Real Compañia de Filipinas ship, the San Jose.

Charged upon arrival with manuscript "12" Reales.



Straight Line Back "FILIPINAS"
Without Period After "FILIPINAS".
Used Between 1835 - 1850. Measuring 45 mm.

1841 MARCH 30: MANILA to CORELLA, SPAIN

Via CALCUTTA - CAPE OF GOOD HOPE

Carried by the Spanish Naval Frigate (Nueva) "Victoria".

Rated "8" Reales, the Single Outbound Rate to Spain.



Boxed-in Red "FILIPINAS" Used Between 1835 - 1850

1835 JANUARY 27: MANILA to ASTORGA, SPAIN

Rated "8" Reales, the Single Outbound Rate to Spain.

Postal marking applied in Spain and not in Manila.



Carried by the ship "Fortuna".

Rated 2/2d for 1/4 ounce weight.

1842 NOVEMBER 24: MANILA to CADIZ

Via CAPE OF GOOD HOPE - FERROL

Rated large numeral "8R", the Single Outbound Rate to Spain.

Black Baeza "MANILA - 31 - IS.s FILIP.s" Used Between 1843 - 1869. Measuring 28 mm Diameter.

1844 JANUARY 14 MANILA to CADIZ, SPAIN

Backstamped Cadiz, June 3, 1844.

Blue Baeza **"MANILA - 31 - IS.*** **FILIP.***" Used Between 1849 - 1853. Measuring 28 mm Diameter.

> Fancy Blue Framed "FRANCO" Used Between 1849 - 1855

1849 APRIL 13 MANILA to MONDRAGON, SPAIN

Postage pre-paid in Manila per fancy framed "FRANCO" marking.

Straight-line Black "MANILA" Used Only in 1845

1845 FEBRUARY 23 MANILA to NAVARRA, SPAIN

"S.N." (Servicio Nacional) folded letter sheet originating from INABANGAN (CEBU) and dated December 29, 1844.

Received in manuscript, July 11.

Blue Baeza "MANILA - 31 - ISL.s FILIPI.s

Used Between 1851 - 1863. Measuring 29.5 mm Diameter

1853 JULY 6: MANILA to CADIZ, SPAIN

Received Algeciras, September 19, and Cadiz, September 21.





Black Baeza "MANILA - 31 - ISL.s FILIPI.s Used Between 1853 - 1862. Measuring 29.5 mm Diameter

1860 JULY 18 LINGAYEN, PANGASINAN to MANILA

With 5c Isabella II issue for Single Local Rate.





Blue Baeza **"MANILA - 31 - IS.s FILIPI.s**Used Only for A Short Period in 1851.
Measuring 29.5 mm Diameter

1851 JANUARY 23: MANILA to CADIZ

Via SUEZ - ALEXANDRIA - ALGECIRAS Backstamped Cadiz, April 19.

Pre-paid "6" Reales Single Outbound Rate.

Via ACAPULCO - VERA CRUZ - HAVANA - SAN ROQUE

Red straight line "FILIPINAS" postmark, type used between 1787 - 1800.

Carried by the Spanish bergantin "Feliz".

Rated "4.U." (Reales de Vellon) or "8" (Reales de Plata), the Single Outbound Rate to Spain set in 1800.

1797 MARCH 11: MANILA to ROME

Via ACAPULCO - MEXICO CITY - VERA CRUZ -HAVANA - SPAIN

Red straight line "FILIPINAS" and black "FRANCA / AZAS" postmarks, carried by the annual Manila galleon to Acapulco.

Addressed to the Director of "Danske Asiatike Compagnie".

Carried by the steamer "Reform" to Hamburg.

Backstamped "SCHIEFS BRIEF-POST / HAMBURG / 6 JUL".

With disinfecting notice "CUXHAVENER QUARANTAINE/ DR. A.C.T. MEIER".

Charged 4/, Ship Letter Rate to Germany.

Via MACAO - HONG KONG - GALLE - CALCUTTA - CAPE OF GOOD HOPE LONDON - LIVERPOOL - SOUTHAMPTON - NEW YORK

By private ship "Great Western" from Hong Kong to London, received as "PAID SHIP LETTER / 8 JY 1841". Sent by mistake to Liverpool. Re-directed to Southampton for Trans-Atlantic crossing to New York, arriving July 19. Forwarding Agent: RUSSELL & STURGIS, MANILA

Charged 2/8d per 1/4 oz., British Packet Rate from India effective October 1, 1839, with 1/ as pre-paid Trans-Atlantic Rate.



1842 MARCH 10: MANILA to NANCY, FRANCE
Via SINGAPORE - CAPE OF GOOD HOPE - LONDON - NETHERLANDS - BELGIUM

Per contents carried by the English barque "Belhaven".

Endorsed to the "Eduard" for the Netherlands with "ZEEBRIEF * ZIERIKZFE / 19 / 9"

Rated 2/4d per 1/2 oz., 1844 Hong Kong Bearing Rate and 1/5d at Port of Gibraltar for delivery to Cadiz.

Boxed-in "BRITISH FOREIGN" marking applied in Hamburg. Received London, March 2, 1838.

Rated 3/8d per 1/2 oz., Packet Rate from India and 1/10d each for French and German Posts.

1838 OCTOBER 26: MANILA to MADRID

Via SINGAPORE - BOMBAY - MOCHA - SUEZ - ALEXANDRIA - MARSEILLES - BARCELONA

Carried privately to Marseilles, the above route detailed in letter contents.

Received Barcelona with maritime "DE FRANCA" entry.

Rated 5R (Reales) per 1 1/4 oz.,

1852 JULY 9: MANILA to SALEM

Via HONG KONG - GALLE - SUEZ - ALEXANDRIA -MARSEILLES - LONDON - LIVERPOOL - BOSTON

From George Abott, via P&O Line to Marseilles. Cunard ship the "Niagra" to Boston, with "BR. PACKET / BOSTON" October 29 receiving postmark.

Rated 65c: 34c British Mail; 10c French Transit; 16c Trans-Atlantic Rate and 5c for U.S. Inland Delivery.
