Von Gronau Round-the-World Flight in 1932 Flown from Manila to Germany

This flight showed Germany's success in non-military aviation design.

Under the 1919 Treaty of Versailles, Germany could not build military aircraft. The Dornier factory at Friedrichshafen built twinengined sea-planes. Wolfgang von Gronau made a flight round the world on the *Gronland-Wals* (Greenland Whale). He landed at Manila on 27 Sept.
