By Air from either Singapore or Hong Kong (1936-39)

In March 1936 Imperial Airways began a feeder service to connect Hong Kong with the main service at Penang. This meant that there were now two routes for Philippine airmail to Europe: via Hong Kong or via Singapore. Because the rates were higher via Hong Kong than via Singapore, each letter was marked with its intended route.
