

## Greek Currency Control Cachet

Commencing in late 1936, Greek Customs scanned mail unloaded at Athens for further distribution to other European countries. A circular cachet with 23 mm diameter was stamped on the front of such letters.

An Athnai (Athens) machine cancel was applied to such mail usually on the reverse, but on the front of the lower cover.
