Crash of the Centurion

This cover was carried on the Imperial *Centurion*, which crashed at Calcutta.

The explanatory cachet was applied in Britain.



Route

Manila to Singapore by sea.

The Imperial *Centurion* started its journey from Sydney on 7 June. It stopped at Singapore on 11 June, where it picked up the mail including this letter. It crashed on landing at Calcutta going into the Hooghly River.

Most of its 40 bags of mail was recovered.

Champion carried the mails onwards departing Calcutta on 14 June and reaching Southampton on 17 June. Surface to Switzerland.

Markings

Stamps were applied by the sender in Manila, and these were washed off when the plane was submerged.

Parts of three strikes of the Manila cds are visible.
