Plaza Lunch was said to be one of few restaurants offering decent meals to American and other foreigners in Manila in the 1920s. As an added service to the mailing foreign tourists, a modern postage stamp-dispensing machine was installed by the Bureau of Posts in 1928. But the two-centavo stamps in coil depicting the same “1906 Jose Rizal” postage did not go well with Manila’s hot and humid climate. The stamps’ gum stuck in the coil, and would not dispense properly. The stamp machine operated for only a few months due to this.
