1857 - 1861 QUEEN ISABELLA II ISSUE

First issued in 1857, and lithogrpahed by M. Perez y hijos of Manila, there were five printings made between 1857-1861. The format used for each printing were as follows: 1st and 2nd printings in sheets of 56 (7 x 8): 3rd printing in sheets of 48 (6 x 8); and, the 4th and 5th printings in sheets of 132 (12 x 11). A total of 15,000 stamps were issued. A die, consisting of a single block-of-four varieties, was used to make up the sheets; in cases where a block cannot be fitted, certain positions of the dies were used to fill up the remaining space.

Type 1: Has 71 pearls, with one pearl on the right side just below the middle generally missing. The "N" of "INTERIOR" is below the level of "I" and "T".

Type 2: Has 71 pearls, with none missing.

Type 3: Has 65 pearls.

Type 4: Has 67 pearls.

Note: The PEARLS referred to are the dots inside the circle around the portrait.


