E. Mayon Chapter No. 1, Order Eastern Star

Mayon Chapter No.1, located at Manila, was granted a charter by the General Grand Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star (Indianapolis, Indiana) on October 29, 1904. The Order of the Eastern Star is a Freemasonic appendant body open to both men and women. It was established in 1850 by lawyer and educator Rob Morris, a noted Freemason. The order is based on teachings from the Bible but is open to people of all religious beliefs. Members of the Order are aged 18 and older; men must be Master Masons and women must have specific relationships with Masons. Originally, a woman would have to be the daughter, widow, wife, sister, or mother of a master Mason, but the Order now allows other relatives. The Order of the Eastern Star symbolizes the Star of Bethlehem (Christmas Star); revealing the birth of Jesus which also represents relationship with the planet Venus, also called the "eastern star." Each point on the star has an emblem of a different biblical heroine: Adah, Ruth, Esther, Martha, and Electa, representing the important qualities of the order.
